Learning Outcomes.

- Students will be able to apply calculus techniques involving exponential, logarithmic, and inverse trig functions.
- Students will be able to compute integrals of complicated functions.
- Students will be able to use calculus techniques to analyze curves described by parametric equations or polar coordinates.
- Students will be able to apply concepts of convergence of infinite sequences and series.
- Students will be able to generate power series representations of functions.
- Students will gain an appreciation for the significance of the calculus in the history of scientific thought.

Attendance. You are expected to attend all classes. Excessive amounts of absenteeism may result in a lower grade. If you do miss a class, it is your responsibility to obtain from a classmate any notes, assignments, handouts, or anything else you may have missed.

Calculator. Occasionally, a graphing calculator will be helpful to have in class. No calculator of any kind will be allowed on exams.

Homework. We will be using the online homework delivery system WebWork. You can access WebWork from the Blackboard web site. To log in, use your network user id for your username, and your student id number for your password. WebWork will give you instant feedback on each problem, and if you get a problem wrong you can try again. This will allow you to find out what you did wrong and hopefully to understand the topic of the question better. Homework will be discussed at the beginning of each class. If all your questions are not addressed during this time, do not hesitate to seek additional help. The following help options are available:
